
The Judith Ann Mogan Foundation (JAMF) invited eligible nonprofits and publicly funded organizations to submit a Letter of Inquiry (LOI), followed by a grant application process for those who qualified, through JAMF's online portal at www.jamoganfoundation.org. 2022 saw the distribution of more than \$1.4MM in grants to 39 projects from 35 organizations.


