2024 Grant Cycle Highlights

- JAMF Received 62 grant submissions for a total of \$6,147,705 in 2024.
- 44 projects were awarded from 42 different organizations.
- Projects benefiting Community Health was the top priority area awarded for large grants.
- The leading priority area for small grants under \$25,000 went to the Children & Youth priority area.
- Awarded grants ranged from \$3,500 to \$433,000 including multi-year grants.

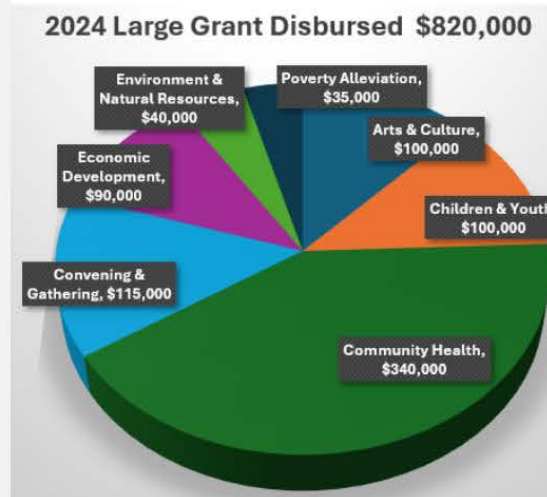
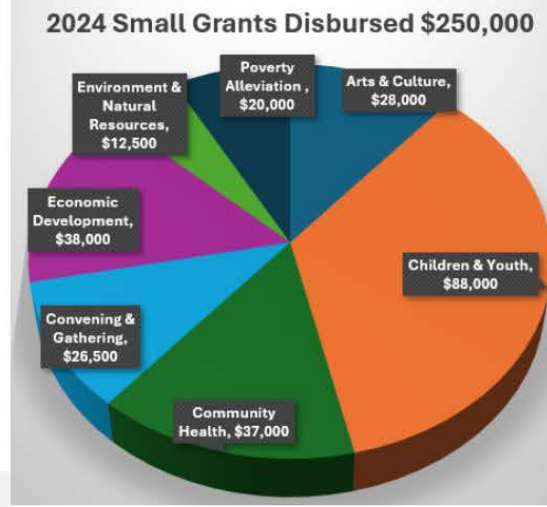
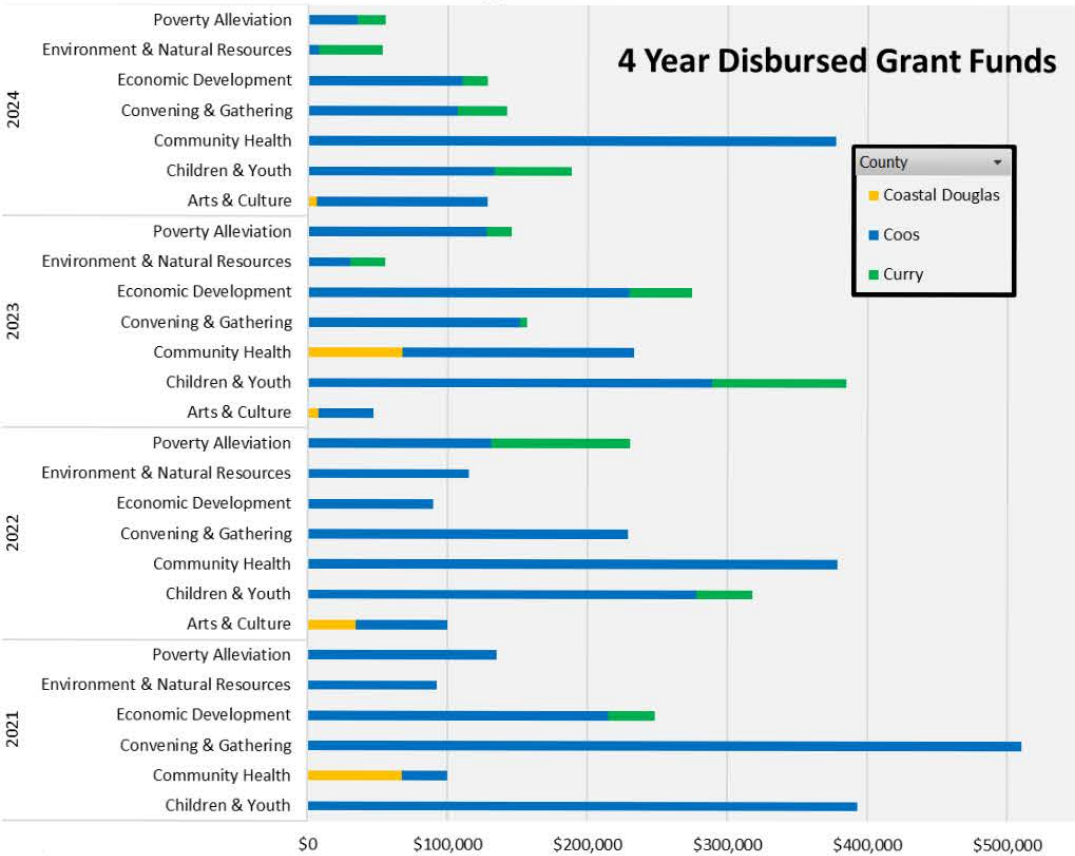
