# 2024 Grant Cycle Highlights

- JAMF Received 62 grant submissions for a total of \$6,147,705 in 2024.
- 44 projects were awarded from 41 different organizations.
- Projects benefiting Community Health was the top priority area awarded for large grants.
- The leading priority area for small grants under \$25,000 went to Children & Youth.
- Awarded grants ranged from \$3,500 to \$433,000 including 2 multi-year grants.



## **Curry County Master Gardner Association**




