


## 2025 Grant Cycle Highlights

- JAMF Received 94 submissions for a total request of \$3,648,630 during the 2025 grant cycle.
- Small grant request submissions totaled \$731,339. Of the 56 applications received, 26 projects received funding.
- Large grant applications totaled \$2,917,291, of which JAMF approved 25 of the 38 projects that were submitted.


## 2025 Priority Areas Awarded

### 2025 Grantee Spotlight - Small Grant Award Sunrise Enterprises of Roseburg, Inc.

The Sunrise Shop & Save thrift store in Reedsport serves as a unique community resource, offering hands-on retail training integrated with real-world work experience. This model not only provides practical skills but also fosters community engagement and personal development. This project aims to provide individuals with disabilities in Reedsport with the skills, confidence, and support necessary to achieve their employment goals, while also strengthening community partnerships and enhancing store operations.

### 2025 Grantee Spotlight - Large Grant Award PeaceHealth Sacred Heart Neurosciences Telestroke Expansion

This initiative creates a Telestroke network to reduce rural patient care delays and connect regional emergency rooms through virtual consultations, diagnosis, and treatment. As the only Comprehensive Stroke Center between Portland and Sacramento offering 24/7 neurological intervention, PSHMCRSC will serve as the network hub due to its accreditation, expertise and long history of positive patient outcomes. This large-scale expansion ensures faster stroke intervention, improved procedural accuracy, improved patient recovery, and increased capacity to support a regional network of 8-10 rural hospitals. With significant experience in building sustainable, community-focused care programs, PeaceHealth is uniquely positioned to lead this transformation for rural Oregon patients.
